

MP Governor inaugurates 50 Jan Aushadhi Kendras; MoU signed with Coal India for expansion

MADHYA PRADESH: the Government of Madhya Pradesh marked a significant milestone in healthcare accessibility by inaugurating 50 Jan Aushadhi Kendras District across various Hospitals in the state.

The inauguration ceremony took place at the Kushabhau Thakre International Convention Centre Bhopal, with Mangubhai Patel, the Governor of Madhya Pradesh, as the Chief Guest. Dr. Mohan Yadav, the Chief Minister of Madhya Pradesh, presided over the event.

Jan These Aushadhi Kendras are set to make a substantial impact by providing quality generic medicines at substantially lower prices. The initiative aims to offer

more than 2,000 quality generic medicines and 300 surgical, nutraceutical, and device items, with costs reduced by 50% to 90% compared to branded counterparts. This move is expected to significantly alleviate the financial burden on patients, reducing out-of-pocket expenses for essential medications.

In a related development, the Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Janaushadhi Pariyojana (PMBJP) has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Coal India Limited (CIL) to further expand the reach of Jan Aushadhi Kendras. This agreement, signed at the PMBJP Head Office in New Delhi, outlines the establishment of Jan Aushadhi Kendras in strate-

gic locations across various coalfields managed by Coal India Limited.

According to MoU, the new Jan Aushadhi Kendras establishing at (Coal India Limited) -Kolkata, ECL (Eastern Coalfields Limited) -Sanctoria, West Bengal, BCCL (Bharat Coking Coal Limited) Dhanbad, Jharkhand, CCL (Central Coalfields Limited) - Ranchi, Jharkhand, SECL (South Eastern Coalfields Limited) -Bilaspur, Chhattisgarh, WCL (Western Coalfields Limited) Nagpur, Maharashtra, (Northern Coalfields Singrauli, Limited) Madhya Pradesh. MCL Coalfields (Mahanadi Sambalpur, Limited) Orissa, NEC (North Eastern Coalfields) Assam, and CMPDIL (Central Mining Planning & Design Institute) - Ranchi,



Breast Cancer

Breast cancer is one of the most common cancers that affects women and people assigned female at birth (AFAB). It happens when cancerous cells in your breasts multiply and become tumours. About 80% of breast cancer cases are invasive, meaning a tumour may spread from your breast to other areas of your body.

Breast cancer typically affects women aged 50 and older, but it can also affect women and people AFAB who are younger than 50. Men and people assigned male at birth (AMAB) may also develop breast cancer.

Breast Cancer types

- Invasive (infiltrating) ductal carcinoma (IDC)
- Lobular breast cancer
- Ductal carcinoma in situ (DCIS)
- Triple-negative breast cancer (TNBC)

Inflammatory breast cancer (IBC)

 Paget's disease of the breast

Symptoms

Change in breast size, shape, or contour

Mass or lump (as small as a pea)


Persistent lump or thickening in breast or underarm

Changes in skin appearance (dimpled, puckered, scaly, inflamed, red, or darker)

Marble-like hardened area under skin

Blood-stained or clear fluid discharge from nipple





Stages of breast cancer

Stage 0: Non-invasive; cancer hasn't spread beyond breast ducts.

Stage I: Cancerous cells in nearby breast tissue.

Stage II: Tumours present; size varies (under 2 cm with lymph node spread or over 5 cm without lymph node spread).

Stage III: Locally advanced; cancer in nearby tissue and lymph nodes.

Stage IV: Metastatic; cancer has spread to bones, liver, lungs, or brain.

Management and Treatment

Surgery is the primary treatment for breast cancer. Breast cancer surgeries include:

- Common surgeries include:

Mastectomy I Lumpectomy I Breast reconstruction

- Additional treatments may include:

Chemotherapy I Radiation therapy I Immunotherapy I Hormone therapy I Targeted therapy**
