International expansion of Janaushadhi Scheme (PMBJP)





18 JAN AUSHADHI KENDRAS at Indian Railway Stations

Andhra Pradesh to promote generic medicines to ease financial burden, says Health Minister



VIJAYAWADA: The State government is aiming to reduce the financial burden on the poor by increasing access to generic medicines and promoting their usage, said Health Minister Y Satya Kumar Yadav.

Accusing the previous YSRC government of neglecting generic medicines, the minister revealed that, of the total sale of medicines worth Rs 10,000 crore in the State, generic medicines account for only 7%.

Replying to questions raised by the MLAs, Minister Satya Kumar informed the House that there are only 215 Jan Aushadhi Kendras in the State, while the Union government has established 13,822 Kendras across the country under the Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Janaushadhi Kendra scheme.

छह गुणा बढ़ें जन औषधि केंद्र, आसानी से मिलेगी सस्ती दवा

प्रधानमंत्री जन औषधि योजना का दायरा मुरादाबाद में काफी तेजी से बढ़ा है। योजना के अंतर्गत शहर में संचालित होने वाले जनऔषधि केंद्रों की संख्या छह गुना बढ़ गई है। कुछ अरसे पहले तक शहर में सिर्फ सात जनऔषधि केंद्र ही संचालित हो रहे थे। अब इन केंद्रों की संख्या बढ़कर चालीस के पार पहुंच गई है। योजना के अंतर्गत देशभर में 25 हजार नए जनऔषधि केंद्र खोलने का लक्ष्य निर्धारित करने के बाद मुरादाबाद में भी नया केंद्र खोलने के लिए लोगों की तरफ से आवेदनों की झडी लग गई। जिला अस्पताल परिसर में संचालित जनऔषधि केंद्र के प्रभारी वरुण चौहान ने नए केंद्रों के बारे में प्राप्त जानकारी का हवाला देकर बताया कि कई आवेदन मंजूर होने के बाद शहर में संचालित जनऔषधि केंद्रों की संख्या बढकर ४२ पहुंच गई है। अब घनी आबादी वाले मोहल्लों और कई मलिन बस्तियों तक जनऔषधि योजना की सहलियत उपलब्ध हो गई है। जिसके चलते लोगों को अब अपने घर के नजदीक ही सस्ती जेनरिक दवाएं मिल सकेंगी। कुछ समय बाद शहर में जनऔषधि केंद्रों की संख्या और बढकर पचास तक पहुंचने की उम्मीद है।




भारत सरकार प्रधानमंत्री जन औषधि केंद्र खोलने के लिए लोगों को प्रोत्साहित करती है. इसे खोलने की प्रक्रिया काफी सरल है. केंद्र खोलने के लिए सरकार द्वारा तय की गई कुछ नियम और शर्तों का पालन करना होता है. सरकार द्वारा केंद्र खोलने की आयत उन्हीं को दी जाती है जिनके पास डी फार्मा या बी फार्मा का सर्टिफिकेट होता है।

प्रधानमंत्री जन औषधि केंद्र खोलने के लिए तीन कैटेगरी तय की गई हैं. जिम पहले में डॉक्टर, फार्मासिस्ट या फिर रजिस्टर्ड मेडिकल प्रैक्टिशनर आते हैं. दूसरी कैटेगरी में ट्रस्ट प्राइवेट हॉस्पिटल और एनजीओ आते हैं. तीसरी कैटेगरी में ऐसे लोग होते हैं जिन्हें स्टेट गवर्नमेंट द्वारा नॉमिनेट किया जाता है। इसके साथ ही आपके पास 120 वर्ग फुट की जगह भी होनी जरूरी होती है।













HIV and AIDS



Overview

Human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) is a virus that attacks the body's immune system. Acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS) occurs at the most advanced stage of infection. HIV targets the body's white blood cells, weakening the immune system. This makes it easier to get sick with diseases like tuberculosis, infections and some cancers. HIV is spread from the body fluids of an infected person, including blood, breast milk, semen and vaginal fluids. It is not spread by kisses, hugs or sharing food. It can also spread from a mother to her baby.

HIV can be prevented and treated with antiretroviral therapy (ART). Untreated HIV can progress to AIDS, often after many years.

WHO now defines Advanced HIV Disease (AHD) as CD4 cell count less than 200 cells/mm3 or WHO stage 3 or 4 in adults and adolescents. All children younger than 5 years of age living with HIV are considered to have advanced HIV disease.

Signs and symptoms

EARLY SPREAD

HIV spreads easily in the first months, often without symptoms.

INITIAL SYMPTOMS

Fever, headache, rash, and sore throat (flu-like illness).

PROGRESSION

Weakens the immune system, causing swollen lymph nodes, weight loss, fever, diarrhea, and cough.

SEVERE ILLNESSES

(if untreated): Tuberculosis, meningitis, severe infections, and cancers like lymphomas and Kaposi's sarcoma.

Transmission

HIV spreads through blood, breast milk, semen, vaginal fluids, and during pregnancy or delivery but not via casual contact like hugging or sharing food. People on ART with an undetectable viral load cannot transmit HIV, highlighting the importance of early and consistent treatment.

Risk factors

Risky Behaviors:

Unprotected anal/vaginal sex; alcohol or drug use during sex.

STIs:

Infections like syphilis, herpes, chlamydia, gonorrhea, bacterial vaginosis.

Needle Use:

Sharing contaminated needles or drug equipment.

Unsafe Medical Practices:

Unsafe injections, blood transfusions, unsterile procedures, or needle stick injuries.

Diagnosis

HIV can be diagnosed with rapid tests or self-tests, but confirmatory testing by a trained health worker is necessary. Most tests detect antibodies within 28 days, but during the "window period," HIV may not be detectable. After a positive result, retesting is essential before treatment. For infants under 18 months, virological testing is required instead of antibody tests. New technologies now allow same-day results at the point of care, facilitating quicker treatment initiation.

Prevention

HIV is preventable by:

Using condoms during sex

Getting tested for HIV and STIs

Considering voluntary male circumcision

Using harm reduction services for people who inject drugs

Prevention options include:

Antiretroviral drugs (ARVs) like oral PrEP, long-acting products, dapivirine vaginal rings, and injectable cabotegravir

ARVs for mothers to prevent transmission to children



People on ART with undetectable viral loads can't transmit HIV, making testing and ART key to prevention.

Treatment

There is no cure for HIV, but antiretroviral therapy (ART) helps stop the virus from replicating, strengthening the immune system. ART doesn't cure HIV but allows people to live healthy lives by reducing the virus in the body and preventing symptoms. ART must be taken daily for life. People with undetectable viral loads cannot transmit HIV. Pregnant women with HIV should start ART early to protect their health and prevent transmission to the baby. WHO is working to reduce advanced HIV disease, and new treatments and injectable medicines are being developed for better care.
